AN ACT to enable the Council of the Municipality of Kingborough to enter into Arrangements with the Corporation of the City of Hobart for the Supply of Water to the said Municipality and for the Construction by the Council of Works in connection therewith, and to authorise the Council to borrow a Sum of Money not exceeding Six thousand Pounds.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Kingborough Water Act 1941*. Short title.

Kingborough Water.

A.D. 1941. **2** In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—

Interpretation.

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of Kingborough:

“Waterworks” extends to and includes all reservoirs, wells, cisterns, tanks, aqueducts, watercourses, watermains, tunnels, feeders, drains, channels, cuts, flood-gates, sluices, conduits, filters, troughs, dams, embankments, pumps, culverts, pipes, pipe-breaks, engines, buildings, and other works of what kind soever which may at any time be necessary or used for effecting the purposes of this Act.

Power to contract.

3 The Council is hereby empowered and authorised to make and enter into such contracts with the Hobart City Council for the supply to the Council by the Hobart City Council of water to be taken from the mains or reservoirs of that Council at such places and in such manner and on such terms and in such quantities as shall be mutually agreed upon.

Use of water.

4 It shall be lawful for the Council to use all or any portion of such water for the purposes of supplying to the inhabitants of any portion of the Municipality of Kingborough water for domestic and manufacturing purposes and for motive power and irrigation and such other purposes as may be required, and the Council may construct, erect, maintain, alter, and remove all such waterworks as may be deemed necessary to supply such water accordingly.

Application of
Lands Clauses
Act 1857.

5 The Council is hereby empowered to acquire compulsorily or by agreement in accordance with the provisions of the *Lands Clauses Act 1857* any land, and any easements, licences, rights, powers, or authorities over any land which it may consider necessary for the purposes of this Act and of the said waterworks. Provided that, in the application of the said Act to this Act—

I. The word “land” shall include easements, licences, rights, powers, and authorities as before mentioned:

II. Sections eight and nine of the said Act shall be excepted.

Provided further that no waterworks shall be established by the Council within the area of the City of Hobart except by agreement with the Hobart City Council.

Power to borrow
£6000.

6 It shall be lawful for the Council, on behalf of the Corporation of the Municipality of Kingborough, to borrow, under the provisions of section one hundred and ninety-three of the *Local Government Act 1906*, any sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of six thousand pounds for the carrying out of any of the matters authorised by this Act and in carrying out any contract made as aforesaid.
