

## LICENSING (No. 2).

No. 50 of 1967.

AN ACT to amend the *Licensing Act 1932*.

[24 November 1967.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Licensing Act* (No. 2) 1967. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Licensing Act 1932*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section sixty-six of the Principal Act is amended— Permits for social gatherings in hotels and clubs.

(a) by omitting from paragraph (b) of subsection (7) the word “and”; and

(b) by adding at the end of that subsection the following word and paragraph:—

“; and

“(d) has effect to authorize, during the period of ten minutes after the permit ceases to be in force, the presence on those premises of such of those persons as were on the premises when the permit ceased to be in force and opening of any doors necessary to permit their egress from the premises.”.

**3** Section ninety-four of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (4) the words “the hour of ten of the clock in the afternoon of any day” and substituting “the hour specified in the fourth column of the fourth schedule as the closing hour on any day for the premises to which the licence relates”. Offences by holders of hotel and public-house licences.
