AN ACT to amend the *Licensing Act 1932*.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Licensing Act (No. 3)* 1937. Short title.

2—(1) Where a licensee or the secretary of a registered club or the agent of either of such persons is convicted of any contravention of any of the provisions of—

I. Paragraphs I. to III. of section ninety-one :

II. Paragraph I. of subsection (2) or paragraph I. of subsection (3) of section ninety-four : or

III. Section ninety-five—

of the Principal Act, and such contravention occurred on a Sunday, he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than twenty pounds, and not more than fifty pounds.

(2) Where any person is convicted of any contravention of the provisions of subsection (9) or of paragraph VII. of subsection (11) respectively of section ninety-seven of the Principal Act, and such contravention occurred on a Sunday, he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than five pounds and not more than twenty pounds.

(3) Such penalties as aforesaid shall be in substitution for, and not in addition to, the penalties prescribed by the Principal Act in respect of such contraventions as aforesaid.

(4) If the Court before which any such person is convicted is satisfied that the offence was committed by accident or mistake and without intent to evade any provision of the Principal Act, it shall not be obligatory for the court to impose such minimum penalty as aforesaid.
