

## LAUNCESTON CORPORATION.

No. 55 of 1967.

### AN ACT to amend the *Launceston Corporation Act 1963*. [7 December 1967.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Launceston Corporation Act 1967*.

(2) The *Launceston Corporation Act 1963*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Application for a postal ballot-paper.

**2** Section forty-four of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by omitting from subsection (1) the words “the day before” and substituting therefor the words “noon of”; and

(b) by omitting from subsection (4) the words “delivered or posted to the postal voter making the application”, and substituting therefor the words “handed to the postal voter at the town hall or posted to him”.

Postal votes: how recorded.

**3** Section forty-five of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by omitting from paragraph (e) of subsection (1) the words “and, unless the authorized witness will deliver the vote personally, together with the postage necessary for posting it as a prepaid letter to the returning officer at Launceston”;

(b) by transposing in subsection (2) the word “and” from the end of paragraph (b) to the end of paragraph (a);

(c) by omitting paragraph (c) of that subsection; and

(d) by inserting after subsection (2) the following subsection:—

“(2A) The postal voter shall forthwith arrange for the fastened wrapper to be either—

(a) delivered to the returning officer or to any presiding officer at any polling place; or

(b) posted as a prepaid letter to the returning officer at Launceston.”.

- 4** Section fifty-three of the Principal Act is amended—
- (a) by omitting from subsection (2) the words “any extraordinary vacancies” and substituting therefor the words “an extraordinary vacancy which the council requires to be filled or upon the occurrence of two or more extraordinary vacancies”; and
- (b) by omitting from that subsection the words “sufficient qualified citizens to supply the vacancies” and substituting therefor the words “a qualified citizen or sufficient qualified citizens to supply the vacancy or vacancies”.

When extraordinary vacancy arises.

**5** Section one hundred and sixty-four of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (2) the words “of the delivery of the sealed copy under subsection (18) of that section” and substituting therefor the words “on which the sealed plan took effect under that section”.

Roads in building estates.

**6** The third schedule of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from Form 4 the words “Insert one of the figures 1, 2, 3, 4 and so on in consecutive order against the name of each of the candidates”, and substituting therefor the following words “Insert the figures \* in any order opposite the names of the candidates for whom you wish to vote.

The third schedule.

“\* Insert numerals for example ‘1, 2, 3 . . .’ and so on up to the number of vacancies.”.

### No. 56 of 1967.

AN ACT to make provision with respect to the tabling in Parliament of reports made by statutory authorities and to amend certain enactments.

[7 December 1967.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1** This Act may be cited as the *Statutory Authorities' Reports Act 1967*.

Short title.
