BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

2 The Treasurer may raise, borrow, and receive any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of two hundred and twenty-three thousand three hundred and fifty pounds seventeen shillings and sevenpence and apply the same in payment of the discount payable and expenses incurred in connection with the raising of the loans authorised by the Acts set out in the schedule.
