No. 35 of 1970.

AN ACT to authorize the issue and application of moneys from the Loan Fund for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1971, and to provide for matters incidental thereto. 12 November 1970.1

RE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Loan Fund Appropriation Short title and com- $Ac\bar{t}$ 1970-1971.

- (2) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of July 1970.
- 2—(1) Subject to this Act, the Treasurer may issue out of the Issue and Loan Fund for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of of moneys June 1971 sums of money not exceeding in the whole \$41,163,000, from Loan Fund. being sums in addition to those that he is authorized so to issue pursuant to the Loan Fund Supply Act 1970-1971.
- (2) The sums authorized to be issued out of the Loan Fund by this Act and by the Loan Fund Supply Act 1970-1971 for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1971, amounting, as appears by the first schedule, to the sum of \$57,663,000, are appropriated for, and shall be applied for, the works and purposes specified in the second schedule.
- 3 The Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing on behalf of the Borrowing State, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of the sum of powers. \$34,570,000.
- 4 The issue and application pursuant to section seven A of the Ratification Public Account Act 1957 of the sums of money specified in the third expenditure. schedule for the purposes specified therein are ratified.

WAGES BOARDS.

No. 36 of 1970.

AN ACT to amend the Wages Boards Act 1920. [17 November 1970.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title

- 1-(1) This Act may be cited as the Wages Boards Act 1970.
- (2) The Wages Boards Act 1920, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
