

(2) The regulations—

- (a) may be so made as to have a different application according to such factors as may be specified in the regulations; and
- (b) may impose a penalty not exceeding five hundred dollars for any offence against the regulations.

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## LOAN FUND APPROPRIATION 1971-1972.

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### No. 44 of 1971.

AN ACT to authorize the issue and application of moneys from the Loan Fund for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1972, and to provide for matters incidental thereto. [29 September 1971.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Loan Fund Appropriation Act 1971-1972*. Short title and commencement.

(2) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of July 1971.

Issue and application of moneys from Loan Fund.

**2**—(1) Subject to this Act, the Treasurer may issue out of the Loan Fund for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1972 sums of money not exceeding in the whole \$47,801,403, being sums in addition to those that he is authorized so to issue pursuant to the *Loan Fund Supply Act 1971-1972*, and the *Loan Fund Supply Act (No. 2) 1971-1972*.

(2) The sums authorized to be issued out of the Loan Fund by this Act by the *Loan Fund Supply Act 1971-1972* and by the *Loan Fund Supply Act (No. 2) 1971-1972* for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1972, amounting, as appears by the first schedule, to the sum of \$63,801,403 are appropriated for, and shall be applied for, the works and purposes specified in the second schedule.

Borrowing powers.

**3** The Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing on behalf of the State, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of the sum of \$37,440,000.

Ratification of certain expenditure.

**4** The issue and application pursuant to section seven A of the *Public Account Act 1957* of the sums of money specified in the third schedule for the purposes specified therein are ratified.

AN ACT to impose a land tax.

[13 October 1971.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Land Tax Act 1971*.
