AN ACT to amend the Law of Animals Act 1962.

[Royal Assent 1 May 1985]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the Law of Animals Amendment Act short title. 1985.

Principal Act.

2—In this Act, the Law of Animals Act 1962* is referred to as the Principal Act.

Amendment of long title to Principal Act.

3—The long title to the Principal Act is amended by omitting "certain enactments relating to trespass by" and substituting "and reform certain enactments and rules of common law relating to".

Amendment of section 2 of Principal Act (Interpretation).

4—Section 2 of the Principal Act is amended by omitting the definition of "animal".

Insertion in Principal Act of new Part IV. 5—After Part III of the Principal Act, the following Part is inserted:—

PART IV

Animals Straying on to a Highway

Interpretation: Part IV. 18—In this Part, "damage" includes the death of, or injury to, a person.

Liability for negligence for animals straying on to a highway.

- 19—(1) So much of the common law relating to liability for negligence as excludes or restricts the duty which a person may owe to others to take reasonable care to see that damage is not caused by an animal straying on to a highway is hereby abolished.
- (2) The common law as amended by subsection (1) applies in respect of damage caused on or after the commencement of the *Law of Animals Amendment Act* 1985 by an animal straying on to a highway.
