

MEDICAL AMENDMENT ACT 1982

AN Act to amend the Medical Act 1959 for the purpose of enabling registered chiropractors to carry out certain medical procedures without having to be registered under that Act.

[Royal Assent 28 October 1982]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the Medical Amendment Act 1982. Short title.

1982

Commence-

2—This Act shall commence on the same day as that fixed under section 2 (3) of the Chiropractors Registration Act 1982.

Amendment of section 30 of Medical Act 1959 (Unregi-stered person not to use medical title, &c.).

- **3**—Section 30 of the *Medical Act* 1959* is amended by inserting the following subsection after subsection (1):-
 - (1A) For the purposes of subsection (1), a person who is registered as a chiropractor under the Chiropractors Registration Act 1982 does not practise as a physician or surgeon by reason only of the fact that he practises chiropractic within the meaning of that Act.

Expiry.

4—This Act shall expire at the expiration of the period of 2 years beginning on the commencement of section 2, and after that date the Medical Act 1959 shall have effect as if this Act had never been enacted.
