AN ACT to amend the Motor Accidents (Liabilities and Compensation) Act 1973 and the Workers Compensation Act 1988.

[Royal Assent 10 November 1988]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the *Motor Accidents (Liabilities and Compensation) Amendment Act (No. 2) 1988*. Short title.

Commencement. **2**—This Act shall commence on the day fixed by proclamation under section 2 (2) of the *Workers Compensation Act 1988*.

Principal Act. **3**—In this Act, the *Motor Accidents (Liabilities and Compensation) Act 1973** is referred to as the Principal Act.

Amendment of section 24 of Principal Act (Exclusions from scheduled benefits). **4**—Section 24 of the Principal Act is amended by inserting the following subsection after subsection (1):—

(1A) Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) does not apply in the case of death or bodily injury arising out of an accident involving the use of a motor vehicle which occurs while a worker is travelling in either direction between his place of employment and place of residence, within the meaning of the *Workers Compensation Act 1988*.

Consequential amendment of *Workers Compensation Act 1988*. **5**—The *Workers Compensation Act 1988*† is amended by inserting in section 97 (3) “or any person employed by him” after “him”.
