

## NURSES' REGISTRATION.

### 11 GEO. VI. No. 26.

#### AN ACT to amend the *Nurses' Registration Act* 1927. [2 May, 1947.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Nurses' Registration Act* 1947. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Nurses' Registration Act* 1927\*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section nine of the Principal Act is amended by omitting subsection (1) and substituting therefor the following subsection:— Registration of nurses.

“(1) Any person qualified as provided by this Act may be registered in accordance with this section as a—

- I. General nurse:
- II. Midwifery nurse:
- III. Mental nurse:
- IV. Child Welfare nurse: or
- V. Tuberculosis nurse,

and, if that person possesses the necessary qualifications therefor respectively, any such registration may be in respect of all or any of those classes of nursing.”

**3** Section ten of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting from sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph I. of subsection (1) the word “three” and substituting therefor the word “four”;
- (b) by omitting the word “or” after sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph I. of subsection (1);
- (c) by adding after sub-paragraph (c) of paragraph I. of subsection (1) the following sub-paragraphs:—

“(d) Child welfare nursing: being a person who is registered in accordance with this Act as a general nurse or a midwifery nurse, has attended the practice, lectures, and training of a child welfare training school approved by

the Board for a period of not less than four months, if registered as a general nurse, or not less than six months, if registered as a midwifery nurse: or

- (e) Tuberculosis nursing: has attended the practice, lectures, and training of a tuberculosis hospital approved by the Board for a period of not less than two years, or, if registered as a general nurse, for a period of not less than four months, or, if registered as a midwifery nurse, for a period of not less than six months.”; and

- (d) by inserting after subsection (1) the following subsection:—

“(1A) The Board may exempt from examination in any subject for examination under this Act any person who, having completed a preliminary course of training at any institution approved by the Board as a preliminary training institution, has, during such course of training, passed an examination in that subject of such standard as is approved by the Board.”.

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Commonwealth and State War Service Land Settlement Agreement Act 1947*.

(2) The *Commonwealth and State War Service Land Settlement Agreement Act 1945\**, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
