

- (b) pay to the person from whom moneys are borrowed by the owner the interest accruing due, during the period commencing on the third day of November, 1952, and ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1953, but no longer, on the moneys so borrowed; and
- (c) pay to the owner, upon and subject to such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the Governor and the owner, such sums, calculated on such basis, as may be so agreed upon, in reimbursement of costs, expenses, or losses, incurred by the owner in respect of—
- (i) the dumping of coal by the owner;
 - (ii) the shrinkage or wastage of coal that is so dumped by the owner; or
 - (iii) fluctuations in the price of coal.

(2) A sum that is required for the purpose of meeting a guarantee given by the Governor under this section, or for the purpose of making a payment or reimbursement authorized to be made by the Governor under this section, shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue, which, to the necessary extent, is appropriated accordingly.

(3) The aggregate amount of the principal moneys in respect of which guarantees under this section may be given shall not exceed seventy-five thousand pounds.

**PORT CYGNET COUNCIL (HUON VALLEY
APPLE FESTIVAL) ENABLING.**

No. 82 of 1952.

AN ACT to enable the council of the municipality of Port Cygnet to conduct an annual apple festival and to make provision for matters incidental thereto.

[12 December, 1952.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Port Cygnet Council (Huon Valley Apple Festival) Enabling Act 1952*.

Interpretation.

2 In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—
“council” means the council of the municipality;
“councillor” means a person who is a member of the council;

“municipality” means the municipality of Port Cygnet constituted under the *Local Government Act 1906*;
 “warden” means the warden of the municipality.

3 The council may conduct and manage annually in the municipality an apple festival having for its objects generally the development and improvement of fruitgrowing and the advertising of the primary and secondary products and industries of the municipality and the improvement of the municipality by the provision of amenities for the residents, and such other objects as the council may deem conducive to the attainment of those objects or any of them.

4—(1) For the purposes of this Act the council may—

(a) appoint a committee, to be known as the Huon Valley Apple Festival Committee;

(b) apply in any one year out of its general revenue a sum not exceeding two thousand pounds for the general purpose of the conduct and management of the festival, or for the purposes of this Act or any of them, or for any purpose ancillary thereto.

(2) The committee shall consist of fifteen members, who shall be appointed by resolution of the council.

(3) A member of the committee shall, unless he sooner dies or resigns or is removed from office by resolution of the council, hold office as a member thereof for the term of two years from the date of his appointment.

(4) A person may be appointed as a member of the committee and may hold office as a member thereof whether he is a councillor or not and whether he resides in the municipality or not.

5 The committee may, subject to the directions of the council—

(a) organise, conduct, and manage the festival; and

(b) solicit and receive from any person subscriptions, donations, and contributions in money or in kind for the purposes of this Act or any of them.

Powers of
committee.

6—(1) The Committee shall account to the council, as and when directed by the council to do so, and in any case not later than the thirtieth day of June in each year, for all moneys received by it, whether from the council or from any other person, and for all expenditure incurred by it.

Accounts and
audit.

(2) The accounts of the Committee shall be incorporated in the accounts of the council and shall be subject to audit by the Auditor-General as part of the accounts of the council in manner provided by the *Local Government Act 1906*.

Indemnity.

7 No act or thing done by a member of the committee or by a person acting under the direction of the committee shall, if the act or thing is done in good faith in the execution or purported execution of this Act, subject him personally to any liability, action, claim, or demand.

By-laws.

8 The council may make by-laws for the purposes of this Act and the committee may, with the consent of the warden, make rules (not inconsistent with the by-laws so made by the council) regulating its own procedure and business.

CLARENCE SEWERAGE.

No. 83 of 1952.

AN ACT to authorise the council of the municipality of Clarence to borrow an amount not exceeding five hundred thousand pounds, for the provision of sewerage facilities within the municipality of Clarence, and to confer on the council powers needed for the construction of sewerage works therefor.

[12 December, 1952.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Clarence Sewerage Act 1952*.

(2) This Act is incorporated and shall be read as one with the *Local Government Act 1906*.
