AN ACT to amend the *Wrest Point Casino Licence and Development Act 1968*.

[5 December 1974]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Wrest Point Casino Licence and Development Act 1974*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Wrest Point Casino Licence and Development Act 1968*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Control of
premises.

2 Section 9 of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting, from subsection (2), all the words occurring after the word “ person ”;
- (b) by omitting subsection (3) and substituting therefor the following subsections:—

“(3) Where the licensee excludes a person, or has a person excluded, under subsection (2), he may notify that person, orally or in writing, that he has been excluded.

“(3A) Where a person has been excluded as provided by subsection (3) the licensee, if he revokes the exclusion, shall give notice thereof to that person and the notice may be oral if the notice of exclusion was given orally or it shall be in writing if the notice of exclusion was given in writing.”; and

- (c) by omitting, from subsection (4), the word “ twelve ” and substituting therefor the word “ fourteen ”.

Power of the
Commissioner
of Police.

3 Section 10 of the Principal Act is amended by omitting subsection (2) and substituting therefor the following subsection:—

“(2) Where the Commissioner of Police makes an order under this section he shall, where practicable, give notice of the order to the person thereby affected.”.

Offences.

4 Section 13 of the Principal Act is amended by omitting subsection (2) and substituting therefor the following subsection:—

“(2) A person notified under section 9 (3) that he has been excluded shall not, unless such exclusion has been revoked, enter the casino.

Penalty: Five hundred dollars.”.
