**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania,  
by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative  
Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled,  
as follows:—

- 1** This Act may be cited as the *Public Health Act 1943*. Short title.
- 2** The Principal Act is hereby amended— Amendment

  - I. As to section three thereof, by inserting— Section 3.
    - (a) After the words “puerperal fever” in the  
definition of infectious disease the words  
“puerperal pyrexia”: and

(b) After the definition of public vehicle, the following new definition—

“‘Puerperal pyrexia’ means any febrile condition occurring in a woman within twenty-one days after childbirth or miscarriage in which a temperature of 100·4° F. or more has been sustained during a period of twenty-four hours or has recurred during that period:”:

Section 91.

II. By deleting the words “(not being the chimney of a private dwelling-house)” in paragraph X. of section ninety-one thereof and inserting after the word “smoke” in the second line of that paragraph the words “or soot”: and

Section 112.

III. By inserting after paragraph IV. of subsection (3) of section one hundred and twelve thereof the following new paragraphs V. and VI.—

“V. Conditions regulating the repair of garments which are dirty:

VI. The measures which are to be taken for the prevention of pollution of any water used for bathing purposes and for the purification of such water where required.”—

and by transposing “and” after paragraph II. to follow paragraph V.
