PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

No. 90 of 1951.

AN ACT to make Provision for Public Holidays on [18 December, 1951.] certain Occasions.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the Public Holidays Act 1951.

Proclamation of holidays.

- **2**—(1) In connection with the forthcoming visit of Her Royal Highness the Princess Elizabeth, Duchess of Edinburgh, the Governor may by proclamation appoint a day to be observed as a public holiday in any city, county, municipality, or other area defined in the proclamation.
- (2) In lieu of a day he may appoint two parts of different days, so long as not more than ten working hours in all are affected.
- (3) For the purposes of this section "working hours" are hours between eight o'clock in the forenoon and six o'clock in the afternoon and no part of a day containing less than four working hours shall be appointed.

Observance of holidays.

- **3**—(1) Any day or part of a day so appointed shall be observed throughout the area in respect of which it is appointed as a public holiday and shall be deemed, for all purposes, to be a bank holiday throughout that area, as if it had been so appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Bank Holidays Act 1919*.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Wages Boards Act 1920†, a day or part of a day so appointed shall in the area for which it is appointed be deemed to be a holiday on full pay for the purposes of every determination under that Act as if it were expressly prescribed in the determination as a holiday on full pay; and notwithstanding the provisions of the said Act or of any such determination, every employee in that area to whom any such determination relates shall be allowed a holiday with full pay on that day or part of a day or shall, if he is not allowed a holiday on that day or part of a day, receive such extra or special payment as is prescribed in the determination in respect of work done on holidays.

(3) Any employer who, contrary to subsection (2) of this section, fails to allow any person employed by him a holiday on full pay on a day or part of a day so appointed or, if the person so employed is not allowed a holiday on that day or part of a day, fails to pay that person at the appropriate rate of payment in respect of work done on holidays, as prescribed in the determination which is applicable to the employment, shall be liable to a penalty of five pounds.

CROWN LANDS (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) (No. 2).

No. 91 of 1951.

AN ACT to authorise the Sale and Alienation of certain Crown Lands, the Closing of certain unused Highways, and the Alteration of certain Notifications relating to the Acquisition of Land by the Crown. [18 December, 1951.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:---

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Crown Lands (Mis-short title cellaneous Provisions) Act (No. 2) 1951.

- (2) This Act shall be incorporated with the Crown Lands Act 1935*, in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- 2 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to the Power of Warden, Councillors, and Electors of the municipality of Commissioner Warden, Head the Crown land described in the first schedule land to the Warden, Warden, for the sum of one hundred and eighty pounds, and upon pay-councillors, ment of the said sum, together with survey and grant fees of the Municipality of the sum of thirty-two pounds three shillings, cipality of the Municipality of the Municipalit the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, Head. convey and alienate that land to the said Warden, Councillors, and Electors in fee simple.
