AN ACT to amend the Police Offences Act 1935.

 \mathbf{B}^{E} it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the Police Offences Amendment Short title. Act 1987.

2—In this Act, the Police Offences Act 1935* is referred to Principal Act. as the Principal Act.

Substitution of section 49c of Principal Act.

Indoor public entertainments on Christmas Day and Good Friday.

3—Section 49c of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted:—

49c—(1) A person shall not hold or conduct an indoor public entertainment on Christmas Day or Good Friday except in accordance with a permit granted under this section.

- (2) An application for a permit under this section—
 - (a) shall be made in writing in a form approved by the Commissioner; and
 - (b) shall be lodged with the Commissioner.

(3) On receipt of an application for a permit under this section, the Commissioner may, subject to subsection (4) and with the approval of the Minister, grant the permit subject to such conditions as he thinks fit.

(4) The Commissioner shall not grant a permit under this section unless he is of the opinion that the holding or conducting of an indoor public entertainment of the nature specified in the application for the permit is in the public interest and does not offend the sanctity of the day specified in the application.

- (5) A permit granted under this section—
 - (a) shall be in writing; and
 - (b) shall specify the conditions, if any, subject to which the permit is granted.
- (6) A person who—
 - (a) contravenes subsection (1); or
 - (b) fails to comply with any conditions specified in a permit granted under this section,

is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding 10 penalty units.
