

PUBLIC OFFICERS PROTECTION.

No. 57 of 1963.

AN ACT to amend the *Public Officers Protection Act 1934.* [1 November 1963.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Public Officers Protection Act 1963.*

(2) The *Public Officers Protection Act 1934*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Resistance and obstruction prohibited.

2 Section seven of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by omitting from subsection (1) thereof the words “Twenty pounds, or six months’ imprisonment” and substituting therefor the words “One hundred pounds or twelve months’ imprisonment”; and

(b) by omitting from subsection (2) thereof the words “Ten pounds, or three months’ imprisonment” and substituting therefor the words “Fifty pounds or six months’ imprisonment”.

PHARMACY.

No. 58 of 1963.

AN ACT to amend the *Pharmacy Act 1908.* [1 November 1963.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Pharmacy Act 1963.*

(2) The *Pharmacy Act 1908*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Exemption for sale of certain medicines and drugs.

2 Section thirty-nine of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (1) the words “, during a period of four years from the commencement of the *Pharmacy Act (No. 2) 1959*”.
