PLUMBERS' REGISTRATION.

No. 50 of 1964.

AN ACT to amend the *Plumbers' Registration Act 1951*. [26 November 1964.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Plumbers' Registration Act 1964*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Plumbers' Registration Act 1951*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section three of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting from subsection (1) the word “five” and substituting therefor the word “six”;
- (b) by omitting from paragraph (d) of subsection (2) the word “and”;
- (c) by adding at the end of that subsection the following word and paragraph:—

Plumbers' Registration Board.

- “; and
- “(f) one shall be the Director of Education or a technical officer of the Education Department nominated by him.”; and
- (d) by inserting, after that subsection, the following subsection:—

“(2A) References in paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of this section to a technical officer of the Education Department shall be construed as references to a person engaged, either in a responsible administrative capacity or in a teaching capacity, in the provision or conduct of technical education in pursuance of the *Education Act 1932*.”.

Vacation
of office.

3 Section five of the Principal Act is amended by omitting paragraph (f) and substituting therefor the following paragraph:—

“(f) being a member appointed under paragraph (e) or paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of section three, ceases to hold an office by virtue of which he could be appointed a member of the Board under the paragraph of that subsection under which he was so appointed.”.

4 Section six of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

Payment of
members of
the Board.

“6—(1) Where the Board is satisfied that a member of the Board (not being a member appointed under paragraph (e) or paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of section three) has suffered loss of income by reason of his attendance at a meeting of the Board the Board may pay to him such sum as it considers reasonable towards the making good of that loss.

“(2) In addition to any sums that may become payable under subsection (1) of this section the Board shall pay to its members such travelling and out-of-pocket expenses as may be prescribed.”.

Registration
of plumbers.

5 Section ten of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of subsection (1);
- (b) by omitting from paragraph (a) of subsection (2) the word “; or” occurring at the end thereof;
- (c) by omitting paragraph (b) of that subsection;
- (d) by omitting from that subsection all the words following the word “examination;” (first occurring);
- (e) by inserting after subsection (2A) the following subsection:—

“(2B) The Board shall not grant a certificate of registration under subsection (2A) of this section upon an application made after the commencement of the *Plumbers' Registration Act 1964* except upon the recommendation of the council of the city or municipality within which the prescribed area is situated or an officer of the council authorized by it to give that recommendation.”;

- (f) by inserting in subsection (6), after the definition of “approved authority”, the following definition:—

“‘country’ includes any part of a country outside the Commonwealth, and any territory of such a country;”;

- (g) by omitting from the definition of "reciprocating country" in that subsection the words "a British possession" and substituting therefor the words "any other country".

6 After section ten of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:—

"10A—(1) Where in pursuance of arrangements made under section twenty recognition is accorded in a reciprocating country to certificates of competency issued to persons who have certain qualifications the Board shall, on application by a person who has been registered under this Act and has those qualifications and on payment of the prescribed fee, issue to that person a certificate of competency. Certificates of competency.

"(2) A certificate of competency issued under subsection (1) of this section shall be in such form and contain such particulars as are necessary to secure that it is accorded recognition in the reciprocating country in pursuance of the arrangements referred to in subsection (1) of this section."

7 Section twenty of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting the words "British possession" (twice occurring) and substituting therefor, in each case, the words "other country";
- (b) by inserting, after the word "registration" (first occurring), the words "or certificates of competency";
- (c) by inserting, after the word "registration" (second occurring), the words "or certificates of competency or certificates of competency of a particular kind,";
- (d) by omitting the word "possession" (last occurring) and substituting therefor the word "country"; and
- (e) by adding at the end thereof the following subsection:—

"(2) In this section 'country' has the same meaning as it has for the purposes of section ten."

Provisions as to reciprocity.

8 Section twenty-one A of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting from subsection (1) the words "that prescribed area" and substituting therefor the words "such area or areas as may be specified in the order in accordance with subsection (1A) of this section";
- (b) by inserting after that subsection the following subsection:—

"(1A) Where an order is made under subsection (1) of this section as a consequence of the carrying out of any plumbing work the area or areas specified in the order may be—

- (a) the prescribed area in which the work was carried out;

Prohibition by local authority on undertaking of plumbing work in certain cases.

- (b) all the prescribed areas for the time being contained in the city or municipality in which the work was carried out; or
- (c) the prescribed area in which the work was carried out and any other prescribed area or areas in the city or municipality in which that prescribed area is contained.”;
- (c) by adding at the end of subsection (4) the words “or by declaring that it is not to apply to any specified prescribed area.”; and
- (d) by adding at the end of subsection (5) the words “, otherwise than by extending the areas to which it applies.”.

Transitory provisions.

9 The term of office of the person first appointed after the commencement of this Act a member of the Board under paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of section three of the Principal Act (as amended by this Act) expires on the twenty-eighth day of February 1967.

TOURIST ACCOMMODATION LOANS.

AN ACT to amend the *Tourist Accommodation Loans Act 1945.*
[26 November 1964.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Tourist Accommodation Loans Act 1964.*

(2) The *Tourist Accommodation Loans Act 1945*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section two of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

Interpretation.

“2 In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—

‘Committee’ means the Tourist Accommodation Loans Committee constituted under this Act;
