**AN ACT to amend the Plumbers' Registration Act 1951.**

**[31 August 1977]**

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1—**(1) This Act may be cited as the *Plumbers' Registration Act* Short title and citation. 1977.

(2) The *Plumbers' Registration Act* 1951\*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section 3 of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting from subsection (1) the word “six” and substituting the numeral “7”;
- (b) by transposing the word “and” from the end of paragraph (e) of subsection (2) to the end of paragraph (f);
- (c) by adding at the end of that subsection the following paragraph:—

“(g) one shall be a person nominated by the body of persons known as the Air Conditioning and Mechanical Contractors Association of Tasmania.”; and

- (d) by inserting after subsection (2A) the following subsection:—

“(2B) If the organization referred to in paragraph (a), paragraph (b), or paragraph (g) of subsection (2) ceases to exist, or ceases to exist under the name mentioned in that subsection, the Governor may by order substitute for that organization some other organization that he considers appropriate.”.

**3** Section 7 of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (7) the word “three” and substituting the numeral “4”.

**4** The term of office of the person first appointed after the commencement of this Act a member of the Board under section 3 (2) (g) of the Principal Act (as amended by this Act) expires on 28th February 1979.
