AN ACT to amend the Police Regulation Act 1898 for the purposes of preventing the use of the chequered cap band by persons other than police officers.

[Royal Assent 21 October 1981]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the Police Regulation Amendment Short title. Act 1981. No. 53

Commencement.

Insertion in Police Regulation Act 1898 of section 34A.

Penalty for use of chequered cap band. 2—This Act shall commence on the seventh day after the date on which it receives the Royal Assent.

3—The following section is inserted in the *Police Regulation Act* 1898* after section 34:—

34A—Without affecting the generality of section 34, a person, not being a police officer, who wears, or directs or requires another person to wear, any head dress incorporating a chequered cap band the same as or similar to that required by the Commissioner to be worn by a police officer is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$100.
