the provisions of this paragraph, the principal moneys or so much thereof as has not then been repaid by him shall forthwith be repaid by him to the Treasurer, in default whereof the Treasurer may, without prejudice to the enforcement of any security given in respect of the loan, sue for and recover those moneys as a debt due to the Crown.

- (3) The loan authorized to be made by this section may be made free of interest.
- (4) In this section "approved person" means a person (being a person who is the owner in fee simple in possession free from encumbrances of land at or near Derwent Bridge) who is approved by the Governor for the purposes of this section.
- 3 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money, not Borrowing exceeding fifteen thousand pounds, and apply the sums so borrowed for the purposes of this Act.

AN ACT to amend the Public Works Committee Act [21 December, 1954.] 1914.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Public Works short title, citation, and commence-Committee Act (No. 2) 1954.

- (2) The Public Works Committee Act 1914, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of July 1954.
- 2 Section thirty-two of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:
- "32 The members of the Committee shall each receive, Fees to be by way of remuneration for their services as members thereof, members of a fee for each day on which they attend at a summoned $^{\text{Committee}}$.

- I The Chairman, Vice-Chairman, or member presiding at any meeting in his absence, four pounds four shillings for each day: and
- II Every other member, three pounds three shillings for each day.".

ST. LEONARDS MUNICIPALITY (SALE OF LAND).

AN ACT to authorize the council of the municipality of St. Leonards to sell certain lands. [21 December, 1954.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the St. Leonards Municipality (Sale of Land) Act 1954.

Power of council to sell certain lands.

2 The council of the municipality of St. Leonards may sell the lands respectively described in the schedule to such person or persons, and on such terms and conditions, as the Minister for Lands and Works may approve.

THE SCHEDULE.

(Section 2.)

1. All that piece of land having an area of thirty perches in the Parish of Launceston County of Cornwall, being the land comprised and described in Purchase Grant registered Volume 218 Folio 56.

2. All that piece of land having an area of twenty-eight perches and nine-tenths of a perch in the Parish of Launceston County of

Cornwall being the land comprised and described in Purchase Grant registered Volume 213 Folio 77.
