

14—(1) The Board may, at the time of making a loan or instalment of a loan under this Act, specify the purpose for which it is to be applied.

Power of Board in certain events to refuse to pay instalments on loans and to call in any moneys already lent. *Ibid.*, s. 16.

(2) The Board may, if it is satisfied that any money lent to a person under this Act has not been applied for the purpose for which it was lent, or for some other purpose approved by the Board, or that the money has been expended in a careless or wasteful manner—

- (a) refuse to pay to that person any further instalment on account of the loan; and
- (b) call in the money already lent to that person, whereupon that person shall forthwith repay that money to the Board, together with all interest due or accruing due thereon.

15—(1) No person shall—

- (a) in an application for a loan under this Act, or in evidence in support of such an application, or for the purposes of section seven, make a statement that to his knowledge is false in a material particular; or
- (b) having received a loan under this Act, use it or any part of it contrary to the conditions on which it was made.

Penalty: Two hundred and fifty pounds or six months' imprisonment.

(2) No person who, under section seven, is lawfully required to produce to the Board a book, paper, document, or account, or to give information to the Board, shall fail or refuse to do so without just cause.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.

16—(1) The Governor may make regulations for the purposes of this Act.

(2) Without affecting the generality of the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, the regulations may impose a penalty (not exceeding twenty-five pounds) in respect of any offence against the regulations.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE (No. 2).

No. 58 of 1962.

AN ACT to amend the *Public Works Committee Act 1914.* [11 December 1962.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Committee Act (No. 2) 1962.*

(2) The *Public Works Committee Act 1914*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section sixteen of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by omitting from subsection (1) thereof the words “sanctioned as in this section provided” and substituting therefor the words “it has first been referred to and reported upon by the Committee in accordance with this section”; and

(b) by omitting subsection (5) thereof.

3 Section eighteen of the Principal Act is repealed.

4 Section thirty-two of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

Remuneration
of members
of the
Committee.

“32—(1) Members of the Committee are entitled to be paid such remuneration, calculated at such rates and in such manner, and subject to such provisions, as may be determined by the Tribunal established under the *Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act 1962.*

(2) Until otherwise determined by the Tribunal referred to in subsection (1) of this section, the members of the Committee shall each receive, by way of remuneration for their services as members thereof, a fee for each day on which they attend at a summoned meeting of the Committee at which a quorum is present, and for each day while they are travelling to or from such a meeting, according to the following scale:—

(a) The Chairman, Vice-Chairman, or other member presiding at a meeting, four pounds ten shillings for each day; and

(b) Every other member, three pounds ten shillings for each day.”
