- (2) The Hospitals Act 1918, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Interpretation. 2 Section four of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from the definition of "Director" the words "Director of Medical and Hospital Services" and substituting therefor the words "Director-General of Medical Services".

Director of Medical and Hospital Services. **3** Section six A of the Principal Act is amended by omitting therefrom the words "Director of Medical and Hospital Services" and substituting therefor the words "Director-General of Medical Services".

PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION (No. 2).

No. 38 of 1954.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain public works and purposes, and to authorize the borrowing of certain sums of money, and the reappropriation of certain unexpended moneys, for meeting the cost of those works and purposes, and for the purposes of the Transport Act 1938 and the Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944, and to amend the Public Works Execution Act 1954.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PART I.

PRELIMINARY.

1 This Act may be cited as the Public Works Execution Short title. Act (No. 2) 1954.

PART II.

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

- 2—(1) The public works and purposes that are speci-works and fied in the first schedule may be executed and carried out purposes to be by the Minister administering the Act or Department under carried out.

 or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.
- (2) The cost of a public work or purpose that is specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of that work or purpose.

3 The Treasurer—

- (a) may borrow any sums of money not exceeding Power to Treasurer to borrow
- (b) may re-appropriate the sums that are specified in 7s. 11d. and the fourth schedule (amounting to £1,175,734 re-appropriate £1,175,734 12s. 1d.),

and may apply the sums so borrowed and re-appropriated for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes that are specified in the first schedule.

PART III. TRANSPORT LOANS.

4 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not power to exceeding £399,350, and apply the sums so borrowed in borrow accordance with the provisions of the *Transport Act* 1938 by £399,350 for way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport works. undertaking, as set forth in the second schedule.

PART IV.

HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION LOANS.

5 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not power to exceeding £7,500,000, and apply the sums so borrowed, in Treasurer to accordance with the provisions of the $Hydro-Electric\ Commis-\pounds7,500,000\ for\ sion\ Act\ 1944$, for the purposes of the Hydro-Electric Com-hydro-electric

mission in carrying out the works that are specified in the third schedule.

Authority for construction of works.

6 The construction by the Hydro-Electric Commission of the works that are referred to in Part I of the third schedule is authorized.

PART V.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Amendment of 7—(1) Section five of the Public Works Execution Act Execution Act 1954 is repealed.

- (2) The Public Works Execution Act 1954 is amended—
 - (a) by omitting from section three the numerals "£6,258,870" and substituting therefor the numerals "£6,381,047 4 0";
 - (b) by inserting after item 28 the following heading and item:—

28A. To meet capital costs of hydro-electric power extensions in rural areas as provided by section 32 of the Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944 £122,177 4 0";
