AN ACT to provide for the Execution of certain Public Works. [6 December, 1937.]

A.D. 1937.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :--

1 This Act may be cited as the Public Works Execution Short title. Act: 1937.

PART I.

PUBLIC WORKS GENERALLY.

2 The Minister for Lands and Works may cause the Power to Minister for works specified in Parts I, and II. of the first schedule to be undertaken and executed at a cost not exceeding in each case the amount set forth in those Parts of that schedule in respect of each work, together with the cost of supervision thereof not exceeding the amount provided therefor in Part II. of such schedule.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £365,439 13s. 11d. and reappropriate £92,709 6s. 2d.

- 3 The Treasurer may for the purpose of defraying the cost of the works authorised by section two—
 - 1. Raise borrow, and receive any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of three hundred and sixty-five thousand four hundred and thirty-nine pounds thirteen shillings and eleven pence: and
 - II. Reappropriate the sums specified in Part III. of the first schedule, being the unexpended balances of the amounts appropriated for the items set forth in that part of the said schedule, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of ninety-two thousand seven hundred and nine pounds six shillings and two pence.

Application of certain unapplied balances.

4 If any part of the moneys provided by this Part is not required for the purpose of the work for which it was so provided, the Minister may expend the whole or any part of any such unexpended balance which does not exceed fifty pounds upon any other work which has been authorised by Parliament in respect of the same city or municipality in respect of which the amount was originally provided.

Power to Minister to alter or close channel through Bridgewater Bridge.

- 5—(1) For the purpose of the carrying out and completion of the removal of the Bridgewater Bridge as shown in the plan in the fifth schedule, the Minister at any time may close the existing navigation channel through the bridge for such time as he may consider necessary for such purposes.
- (2) In the event of the construction of the railway bridge not being undertaken before the completion of the road bridge, the Minister shall provide, upon such completion, a temporary channel for navigation through the bridge, and at all times maintain the same until the construction of the railway bridge necessitates the closing thereof.
- (3) On the completion of the railway bridge, the Minister shall provide a permanent channel through the bridge at such point, and of such dimensions as he may think necessary, and the same shall be substituted for the existing channel which may then be permanently closed.
- (4) The Treasurer may pay out of the Consolidated Revenue without further appropriation, to any persons who at the commencement of this Act were engaged in carrying on any commercial transport service for the conveyance of

passengers or goods through the bridge such compensation A.D. 1937. as the Governor, after such enquiry as he may think necessary, may approve in respect of any damage suffered by such person by reason of the closing of such channel as aforesaid.
