BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania,
by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative
Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as
follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Execution Act* 1940. Short title.

Public Works Execution.

PART I.

PUBLIC WORKS GENERALLY.

Power to Minister for Lands and Works to cause works specified in parts I. and II. of first schedule to be executed.

2 The Minister for Lands and Works may cause the works specified in parts I. and II. of the first schedule to be undertaken and executed at a cost not exceeding in each case the amount set forth in those parts of that schedule in respect of each work, together with the cost of supervision thereof not exceeding the amount provided therefor in part II. of that schedule.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £267,730 11s. 6d.

3 The Treasurer, for the purpose of defraying the cost of the works authorised by section two, may raise, borrow and receive any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of two hundred and sixty-seven thousand seven hundred and thirty pounds eleven shillings and sixpence.

Application of certain unapplied balances.

4 If any part of the moneys provided by this part is not required for the purpose of the work for which it was so provided, the Minister may expend the whole or any part of any such unexpended balance which does not exceed fifty pounds upon any other work which has been authorised by Parliament in respect of the same city or municipality in respect of which the amount was originally provided.

PART II.

TRANSPORT WORKS.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £16,690 for transport works.

5 The Treasurer may raise, borrow, and receive any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of sixteen thousand six hundred and ninety pounds, and apply the same, in accordance with the provisions of the *Transport Act 1938*, by way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking, as set out in the second schedule.

PART III.

STATE HYDRO-ELECTRIC WORKS.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £250,000 for purposes of State Hydro-Electric Works.

6 The Treasurer may raise, borrow, and receive any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand pounds, and apply the same in accordance with the provisions of the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1929* in defraying the cost of the execution of the works specified in the third schedule.

Authority for construction of works.

7 The construction by the Hydro-Electric Commission of the works referred to in the third schedule is hereby authorised.
