AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain Public Works and Purposes, and to authorise the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those Works and Purposes.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Execution Act* 1946. Short title.

Public Works Execution.

A.D. 1946.

Works and purposes to be executed and carried out.

2—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.

(2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £219,606 7s. 8d.

3 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £219,606 7s. 8d. and apply the same for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes specified in the first schedule.

Application of certain unexpended balances.

4 If any part of the moneys provided by this Act is not required for the purpose of the work for which it was so provided, the Minister may expend the whole or any part of any such unexpended balance which does not exceed fifty pounds upon any other work which has been authorised by Parliament in respect of the same city or municipality in respect of which the amount was originally provided.
