PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION.

No. 5 of 1948.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain Public Works and Purposes, and to authorise the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those Works and Purposes.

[14 April, 1948.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Execution Act 1948*.

2—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.

Works and purposes to be executed and carried out.

(2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.

3 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £185,751, and may apply the same for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes specified in the schedule.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £185,751.

LATROBE SEWERAGE.

No. 6 of 1948.

AN ACT to authorise the Council of the Municipality of Latrobe to borrow a sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of fifty thousand pounds for the provision of sewerage facilities within the Town of Latrobe, and to confer on the Council powers needed for the construction of sewerage works therefor. [14 April, 1948.]

PREAMBLE.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of a scheme approved by the Water Sewerage and Drainage Board, constituted under the *Water Sewerage and Drainage Board Act, 1944**, the Council of the Municipality of Latrobe intends to construct the works and undertakings by this Act authorised to be constructed, for the purpose of providing sewerage facilities within the Town of Latrobe:
