## PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION.

# No. 23 of 1949.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain Public Works and Purposes, and to authorise the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those Works and Purposes.

[4 May, 1949.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as the Public Works Execution short title. Act 1949.
- **2**—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the Works and schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister be executed administering the Act or Department under or for the pur-and carried poses of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.
- (2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.

# COMMONWEALTH AND STATE WAR SERVICE LAND SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT.

## No. 24 of 1949.

AN ACT to amend the Commonwealth and State War Service Land Settlement Agreement Act 1945. [4 May. 1949.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Commonwealth and State War Service Land Settlement Agreement Act 1949.
- (2) The Commonwealth and State War Service Land Settlement Agreement Act 1945\* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Power to reserve area for soldier land settlement. 2 Section five of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (1) the words "three years and six months" and substituting therefor the words "four years".
