

(2) Every annuity that is in force and payable, or for which a person is eligible, at the commencement of this Act, shall, on and after the commencement of this Act, be paid at a rate increased in accordance with such of the provisions of subsection (1) of this section as may be appropriate.

(3) The Treasurer shall pay to the Fund out of the Consolidated Revenue (which, to the necessary extent, is appropriated accordingly) all such amounts as may be necessary to give effect to the increases in the rates of annuities prescribed by this section.

(4) In this section, "the prescribed amount" means an amount that bears the same proportion to the annual amount of an annuity (as at the first day of January 1952) as twenty-six bears to one hundred and fifty-six.

3 Section two does not apply to any annuity that is payable to a person who is in receipt of a pension under Division I or Division II of Part V of the *Superannuation Act 1938*.

Exclusion of certain annuities from the provisions of this Act.

PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION.

No. 17 of 1955.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain public works and purposes, and to authorize the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those works and purposes, and for the purposes of the *Transport Act 1938*. [6 June, 1955.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PART I.

PRELIMINARY.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Execution Act 1955*. Short title.

Interpretation.

2 In this Act, "Financial Agreement" means the agreement made between the Commonwealth and the States and ratified by the *Financial Agreement Act 1927*, and includes that agreement as varied from time to time and any agreement made in substitution therefor.

PART II.

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

Works and purposes to be executed and carried out.

3—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the first schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.

(2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.

Power of Treasurer to borrow £1,130,550.

4 The Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of any sums of money not exceeding £1,130,550, and may apply the sums so borrowed for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes specified in the first schedule.

PART III.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION LOANS.

Power of Treasurer to borrow £74,270 for transport works.

5 The Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of any sums of money not exceeding £74,270, and may apply the sums so borrowed in accordance with the provisions of the *Transport Act 1938*, by way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking, as set forth in the second schedule.
