PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION.

No. 6 of 1956.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain public works and purposes, and to authorize the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those works and purposes, and for the purposes of the *Transport Act* 1938.

[26 April 1956.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PART I.

PRELIMINARY.

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Execution Act* 1956.

Interpreta-
tion.

2 In this Act, "Financial Agreement" means the agreement made between the Commonwealth and the States and ratified by the *Financial Agreement Act* 1927, and includes that agreement as varied from time to time and any agreement made in substitution therefor.

PART II.

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

3—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the first schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.

Works and purposes to be executed and carried out.

(2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.

4 The Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of any sums of money not exceeding £1,516,265, and may apply the sums so borrowed for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes specified in the first schedule.

Power of Treasurer to borrow £1,516,265.

PART III.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION LOANS.

5 The Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of any sums of money not exceeding £136,200, and may apply the sums so borrowed in accordance with the provisions of the *Transport Act 1938*, by way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking, as set forth in the second schedule.

Power of Treasurer to borrow £136,200 for transport works.

AN ACT to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1957.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Supply Act 1956-1957*.

Short title.

2 There may be issued and applied towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1957 the sum of £3,427,100 out of the Consolidated Revenue, for the purposes and services expressed in the schedule, and the Treasurer is authorized to issue and apply the moneys so authorized to be issued and applied.
