

AN ACT to provide for the Execution of 1934. certain Public Works. [13 December, 1934.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as the Public Works Execution Act Short title. (No. 2) 1934.
- 2 Subject to the provisions of the Public Works Committee Act Power to Minister 1914, as modified by this Act, the Minister may cause all or any of to cause works to the works specified in the first schedule, or any part of such works, to be undertaken and executed at a total cost not exceeding the amount set forth in that schedule.

Public Works Execution (No. 2).

Power to Treasurer to borrow £44,356 4s. 2d. and to reappropriate £135,643 15s. 10d.

- 3 The Treasurer may, for the purposes of defraying the costs of the works authorised by this Act—
 - 1. Raise, borrow, and receive any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of forty-four thousand three hundred and fifty-six pounds four shillings and two pence:
 - u. Reappropriate the sums specified in the second schedule, amounting in the aggregate to one hundred and thirty-five thousand six hundred and forty-three pounds fifteen shillings and ten pence.

Application of 44 Vict. No. 32 and 45 Vict. No. 31.

4 The provisions of the *Public Works Construction Act* 1880 and the *Branch Roads Construction Act* 1881 shall apply to any public works constructed under this Act in the same manner as if those provisions had been incorporated in this Act.

Application of 1 Geo. V. No. 11 or 58 Vict. No. 17. 5 Any land required for the purpose of any public works constructed under this Act, at the option of the Minister, may be acquired under the Lands Resumption Act 1910 or the Land Vesting Act 1894.

Modification of provisions of 5 Geo. V. No. 32 in their application to certain works in first schedule.

- 6 In the application of the provisions of the Public Works Committee Act 1914 to any of the works specified in the first schedule upon which the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works (in this section referred to as "the Committee") may be required to report, as provided by that Act, and has not reported at the date of the submission to Parliament of any such work, the following provisions shall have effect:—
 - It shall not be necessary for the Governor to refer any of such works to the Committee until after the commencement of this Act:
 - II. It shall not be necessary for the House of Assembly to declare that it is expedient to carry out any of such works, and any such work may be commenced if the Committee reports to the Governor that in its opinion such work should be undertaken—

but no such work, or any part thereof, shall be commenced or executed notwithstanding the estimated cost of completing such work may not exceed the sum of five thousand pounds, unless the Committee so reports in respect thereof.

Depreciation fund contribution in respect of certain item. 7 There shall be paid out of the consolidated revenue (which to the necessary extent is hereby appropriated accordingly) to the State Sinking Fund Commissioners, in respect of the period of twenty-six years commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, the yearly sum of three hundred and thirty-two pounds ten shillings for the purpose of providing a depreciation fund in respect of the item in the schedule—" Derwent Valley Railway Extension"
