value of the property in those parts of the municipal districts of such local authorities in respect of which the scheme was prepared.

(6) The regulations may provide for and regulate the payment of contributions to any such common fund, the recovery of contributions which may be in arrear, and the administration of such fund generally.".

Approved scheme may be modified, approval of Commissioner.

- **3** Section twenty-one of the Principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the following subsection:—
- "(3) For the purposes of subsection (2), the decision of the Commissioner as to what constitutes an alteration of or addition to any scheme shall be final and without appeal.".

Pending approval of scheme local authority may prohibit erection of buildings, &c., which would contravene scheme.

4 Section twenty-four of the Principal Act is amended by inserting in subsection (1), after the word "district", the words " or any alteration of the purposes for which any land or building within such district is used", and by inserting in that subsection, after the word "work" (second occurring), the words "or any alteration of any such purposes".

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain Public Works and Purposes, and to authorise the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those Works and Purposes, and for the purposes of the Transport Act, 1938, and the Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944. [28 November, 1947.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the Public Works Execution $Ac\bar{t}$ (No. 2) 1947.

Short title.

PART I.

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

- **2**—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the Works and first schedule may be executed and carried out by the be executed Minister administering the Act or Department under or out. for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.
- (2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.
- 3 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not Power to exceeding £1,293,531 10s. and may apply the same for the borrow purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying 10s. out of the public works and purposes specified in the first schedule.

PART II.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION LOANS.

4 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not Power to exceeding £342,700 and apply the same, in accordance with to borrow the provisions of the *Transport Act* 1938*, by way of capital £342,700 for expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking, works. as set forth in the second schedule.

PART III.

HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION LOANS.

- **5** The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not Power to exceeding £500,000 and apply the same, in accordance with to borrow the provisions of the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act* 1944†, £500,000 for the purposes of the Hydro-Electric Commission in electric carrying out the works specified in the third schedule.
- **6** The construction by the Hydro-Electric Commission Authority for of the works referred to in the third schedule is hereby of works. authorised.
