BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Audit Act 1949.
- (2) The Audit Act 1918*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Salary of Auditor-General

- 2—(1) Section five of the Principal Act is amended by omitting therefrom the words "one thousand two hundred" and substituting therefor the words "one thousand eight hundred".
- (2) This section shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of July, 1949.

PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION (No. 2).

No. 55 of 1949.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain Public Works and Purposes, and to authorize the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those Works and Purposes and for the purposes of the Transport Act 1938, and the Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944.

[29 November, 1949.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the Public Works Execution Act (No. 2) 1949.

PART I.

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

- 2—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the works and first schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister purposes to administering the Act or Department under or for the pur- and carried poses of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.
- (2) The cost of any public work or purposes specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.
- 3 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not Power to exceeding £1,891,337 0s. 3d., and may apply the same for the to borrow purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying £1,891,337 0s. 3d. out of the public works and purposes specified in the first schedule.

PART II.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION LOANS.

4 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not Power to Treasurer exceeding £566,905, and apply the same, in accordance with to borrow the provisions of the $Transport\ Act\ 1938^*$, by way of capital $^{£566,905}_{transport}$ for expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking works. as set forth in the second schedule.

PART III.

HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION LOANS.

- 5 The construction by the Hydro-Electric Commission of Authority for construction the works referred to in the third schedule is hereby authorised. of works.
- 6 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not Power to Treasurer exceeding £944,701, and apply the same, in accordance with to borrow the provisions of the Hydro-Electric Commission in carry-of hydrogeneous the purposes of the Hydro-Electric Commission in carry-of hydrogeneous the works specified in the third schedule ing out the works specified in the third schedule.

PART IV.

FINANCIAL PROVISIONS.

7 The Treasurer may re-appropriate the sum of £805,299, Power of Treasurer to being the amount of loans repaid by the Hydro-Electric Com-re-appropriate mission to the credit of the Hydro-Electric Purchase Act 1914 £805,299. (5 Geo. V. No. 4) Account, and apply the same towards meeting the cost of carrying out the works specified in the third schedule.

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Education Act* 1949. Short title and citation (2) The *Education Act* 1932*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- **2** Section nine of the Principal Act is amended by omitting offences. from subsection (1) the words "One pound" and substituting therefor the words "Five pounds".
- 3 Section nine A of the Principal Act is amended by Employment omitting from subsection (1) the words "section seven "of children prohibited in certain cases."
