PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION (No. 3).

No. 59 of 1950.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain Public Works and Purposes, and to authorise the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those Works and Purposes and for the purposes of the Transport Act 1938, and the Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944.

[29 November, 1950.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the Public Works Execution Short title. Act (No. 3) 1950.

PART I.

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

2—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the works and first schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister purposes to administering the Act or Department under or for the purand carried poses of which those works and purposes are respectively out.

- (2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.
- Power to Treasurer to borrow £1,731,952 3s. 4d.
- 3 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £1,731,952 3s. 4d., and may apply the same for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes specified in the first schedule.

PART II.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION LOANS.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £457,500 for transport works.

4 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £457,500, and apply the same, in accordance with the provisions of the Transport Act 1938*, by way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking as set forth in the second schedule.

PART III.

HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION LOANS.

Authority for construction of works.

5 The construction by the Hydro-Electric Commission of the works referred to in the third schedule is hereby authorised.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £2,500,000 for purposes of hydroelectric works.

6 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £2,500,000, and apply the same, in accordance with the provisions of the Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944†, for the purposes of the Hydro-Electric Commission in carrying out the works specified in the third schedule.

No. 60 of 1950.

AN ACT to appropriate and apply a sum from the Consolidated Revenue for the purposes of certain special grants. [29 November, 1950.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the Appropriation (Special Grants) Act 1950.

Appropriation and application of £17,000.

- **2**—(1) The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue (which, to the necessary extent, is hereby appropriated accordingly) a sum not exceeding £17,000, and apply that sum for the purposes expressed in the schedule.
- (2) The sum appropriated by subsection (1) of this section may be applied in the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1951, and in any subsequent financial years; and may be applied partly in one financial year and partly in any other financial year or financial years.
