

CONSOLIDATED REVENUE DEFICIT (FUNDING) (No. 2).

No. 70 of 1951.

AN ACT to authorise the Funding of the Deficit
in the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the financial
year ended the thirtieth day of June, 1950.
[21 November, 1951.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania,
by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative
Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled,
as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Bill may be cited as the *Consolidated Revenue Deficit (Funding) Act (No. 2) 1951*.

2 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money, not exceeding £141,390 11s. 2d., for the purpose of funding the deficit in the Consolidated Revenue for the financial year ended on the thirtieth day of June, 1950.

PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION (No. 3). No. 71 of 1951.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out
of certain Public Works and Purposes, and to
authorise the borrowing of certain sums of money, and
the reappropriation of certain unexpended moneys, for
meeting the cost of those Works and Purposes, and
for the purposes of the *Transport Act 1938*, and
Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944.
[14 December, 1951.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania,
by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative
Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled,
as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Execution Act (No. 3) 1951*.

PART I.

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

2—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the first schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.

Works and purposes to be executed and carried out.

(2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.

3 The Treasurer may—

(a) borrow any sums of money not exceeding £2,157,871 18s. 10d.; and

(b) re-appropriate the amounts specified in the fourth schedule amounting to £120,055 11s. 2d.;

Power to Treasurer to borrow £2,157,871 18s. 10d. and re-appropriate £120,055 11s. 2d.

and may apply the same for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes specified in the first schedule.

PART II.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION LOANS.

4 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £1,126,017 and apply the same, in accordance with the provisions of the *Transport Act 1938**, by way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking, as set forth in the second schedule.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £1,126,017 for transport works.

PART III.

HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION LOANS.

5 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money not exceeding £4,000,000 and apply the same, in accordance with the provisions of the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944†*, for the purposes of the Hydro-Electric Commission in carrying out the works specified in the third schedule.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £4,000,000 for purposes of hydro-electric works.

6 The construction by the Hydro-Electric Commission of the works referred to in Part I. of the third schedule is hereby authorised.

Authority for construction of works.

7 Upon the amount referred to in Part II. of the third schedule to this Act, or any part of that amount, being made available to the Hydro-Electric Commission, the provisions of section two of the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944‡* shall apply to and in respect of that amount, or, as the case may be, that part thereof, in the same manner and to the same extent in all respects as if that amount, or that part thereof, were
