1 This Bill may be cited as the Consolidated Revenue Deficit (Funding) Act (No. 2) 1951.

2 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money, not exceeding $\pounds 141,390$ 11s. 2d., for the purpose of funding the deficit in the Consolidated Revenue for the financial year ended on the thirtieth day of June, 1950.

PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION (No. 3). No. 71 of 1951.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain Public Works and Purposes, and to authorise the borrowing of certain sums of money, and the reappropriation of certain unexpended moneys, for meeting the cost of those Works and Purposes, and for the purposes of the *Transport Act* 1938, and *Hydro-Electric Commission Act* 1944.

(2) The cost of any public work or purpose specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.
