

PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION (No. 3).

No. 79 of 1954.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain public works and purposes, and to authorize the borrowing of certain sums for meeting the cost of those works and purposes, and for the purposes of the *Transport Act 1938*.

[21 December, 1954.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PART I.

PRELIMINARY.

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Execution Act (No. 3) 1954*.

PART II.

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

Works and purposes to be executed and carried out.

2—(1) The public works and purposes that are specified in the first schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.

(2) The cost of a public work or purpose that is specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of that work or purpose.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £144,400.

3 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money, not exceeding £144,400, and may apply the sums so borrowed for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes that are specified in the first schedule.

PART III.

TRANSPORT LOANS.

4 The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money, not exceeding £100,000, and may apply the sums so borrowed in accordance with the provisions of the *Transport Act 1938* by way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking, as set forth in the second schedule.
