of his preference for at least three candidates (if there are more candidates than two)."; and

(i) by omitting from paragraph 18 the words "the returning officer may, if qualified, vote at an election in addition to giving a casting vote.".

PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION (No. 3).

No. 37 of 1956.

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain public works and purposes and to authorize the borrowing of certain sums of money, and the reappropriation of certain unexpended moneys, for meeting the costs of those works and purposes, and for the purposes of the Transport Act 1938 and the Hydro-Electric Commission Act [29 November 1956.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PART I.

PRELIMINARY.

1 This Act may be cited as the Public Works Execution Short title. Act (No. 3) 1956.

Interpreta-

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2 In this Act "Financial Agreement" means the agreement made between the Commonwealth and the States and ratified by the *Financial Agreement Act* 1927, and includes that agreement as varied from time to time and any agreement made in substitution therefor.

PART II.

PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.

Works and purposes to be executed and carried

- 3—(1) The public works and purposes specified in the first schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.
- (2) The cost of any public work or purposes specified in the first schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of each work or purpose.

Power of Treasurer to borrow £3,037,989 9s. 10d. and re-appropriate £81,170 10s. 2d.

4 The Treasurer—

- (a) may arrange for the borrowing, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of any sums of money not exceeding £3,037,989 9s. 10d.; and
- (b) may re-appropriate the sums that are specified in the fourth schedule (amounting to £81,700 10s. 2d.),

and may apply the sums so borrowed and re-appropriated for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes that are specified in the first schedule.

PART III.

TRANSPORT COMMISSION LOANS.

Power of Treasurer to borrow £43,200 for transport work. 5 The Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of any sums of money not exceeding £43,200, and may apply the sums so borrowed in accordance with the provisions of the *Transport Act* 1938, by way of capital expenditure in connection with the transport undertaking, as set forth in the second schedule.

PART IV.

HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION LOANS.

Power of Treasurer to borrow £6,540,000 for hydro-electric works.

6 The Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of any sums of money not exceeding £6,540,000, and may apply the sums so borrowed in accordance with the provisions of the *Hydro-Electric*

Commission Act 1944 for the purposes of the Hydro-Electric Commission in carrying out the works that are specified in the third schedule.
