BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Flinders Marine Board Loan Act 1969.
- (2) The Flinders Marine Board Loan Act 1952, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Borrowing powers.

2 Section three of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (1) thereof the words "one hundred thousand dollars" and substituting therefor the words "two hundred and fifty thousand dollars".

RACING AND GAMING.

AN ACT to amend the *Racing and Gaming Act* 1952. [25] July 1969.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Racing and Gaming Act 1969.
- (2) The Racing and Gaming Act 1952, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of August 1968.

2 Section forty-five B of the Principal Act is amended by Payments to omitting from subsection (4) the numerals "1969" and sub-horse-racing stituting therefor the numerals "1970".

3 Section seventy-one of the Principal Act is amended by Application omitting from clause (A) of sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph paid by (a) of subsection (2) the words "forty thousand dollars" bookmakers. and substituting therefor the words "forty-five thousand dollars".

JUDGES' SALARIES.

AN ACT to amend the *Judges' Salaries Act* 1920. [14 October 1969.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Judges' Salaries Act short title, citation, and commence-
- (2) The Judges' Salaries Act 1920, as subsequently ment. amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of July 1969.
- 2 Section two of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—
- "2. There is payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Judges' (which, to the necessary extent, is appropriated accordingly)—salaries.
 - (a) to the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Justice, a salary at the rate of eighteen thousand four hundred and fifty dollars a year; and
