1. Short title.
2. Power to Council to pay certain moneys.

AN ACT to authorise the Council of the Municipality of Ringarooma to pay certain Moneys.

WHEREAS certain proceedings were recently instituted by Councillor *Kidd*, a member of the Council of the Municipality of Ringarooma, against other councillors of that Municipality, and such proceedings were subsequently withdrawn upon terms which included the payment by the defendants of the costs thereof :

Preamble.

And whereas such proceedings as aforesaid, related solely to the business of the said Council, and the defendants had no personal interest therein :

Ringarooma Council Enabling.

A.D. 1937. — And whereas the said Council might properly have been joined as a defendant in such proceedings, and if so joined would have been liable to pay, and would properly have paid, such costs as aforesaid :

And whereas it is desirable that the said Council should be authorised to pay such costs :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Ringarooma Council Enabling Act 1937*.

Power to Council to pay certain moneys.

2—(1) It shall be lawful for the Council of the Municipality of Ringarooma to pay to any persons entitled to receive the same, the sum of twenty-four pounds, being the costs payable by the defendants in the proceedings mentioned in the preamble.

(2) If the said sum, or any part thereof, shall have been paid by any of the said defendants, the Council may refund to him any amount so paid.
