AN ACT to amend the *Shops Act 1925*.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Shops Act 1937*.

Short title.

(2) This Act shall commence on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight.

2 The Principal Act is hereby amended—

I. By deleting from section five thereof—

(a) “one” and substituting “nine-thirty” (in line 2) and “Saturday” and substituting “Friday” (in same line) of subsection (1): and

(b) “subsection” and substituting “subsections (1) and” (in line 3); and “the” to “Friday” and substituting “every Saturday” (in the last line) of subsection (2):

Section 8.

II. By inserting in section eight thereof—

(a) “nine-thirty” in substitution for “nine” (in line 3): and

(b) “Monday” (after “following” in the last line)—

of subsection (1):

Section 9.

III. By deleting from section nine thereof—

(a) “nine” and substituting “nine-thirty” (in line 3 of subsection (1)) and adding (at the end of that subsection) “Provided however, that hairdressers’ shops may be kept open between the hours of six of the clock in the forenoon and one of the clock in the afternoon on Saturday (not being Christmas Day).”: and

(b) “also” to “and” (in lines 6 and 7); and “the same day” and substituting “Saturday” (in line 8) of subsection (2): and

IV. By expunging subsection (2) of section fifteen thereof.

3—(1) This Act shall apply to the City of Hobart and to the Municipality of Glenorchy.

(2) In respect of the City of Launceston and of each municipality other than Glenorchy, the provisions of the Principal Act shall be read and construed as if this Act had not been passed.

(3) If at any time after the expiration of six months after the commencement of this Act the Governor is satisfied that it is desirable so to do, he may repeal this Act by proclamation, and such repeal shall take effect on a date to be specified in such proclamation. A.D. 1937
