- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Sesquicentenary Act Short title 1950.
- (2) The Sesquicentenary Act 1949*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

AN ACT to amend the *Prices Act* 1948. [7 December, 1950.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Prices Act (No. 3)* Short title 1950.
- (2) The *Prices Act* 1948*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the twenty-ninth day of November, 1950.
- 2 Section forty-eight of the Principal Act is repealed and Expiry of Act. the following section is substituted therefor:—
- "48. This Act shall expire on the thirtieth day of June, 1951.".
