3 After section forty-seven of the Principal Act the following section is inserted in Part VI.:-
" 47A. In this Part, unless the contrary intention appears, ${ }^{\text {Interpre- }}$ tation. the expression 'executor or administrator therein named' includes the executor of an executor becoming, by representation, the executor of the original estate.".

> 4 Section forty-eight of the Principal Act is amended-
> (a) by inserting in paragraph I. of subsection (1) after the word " he word same" the words, and in the in certain case of an executor of an executor the probate ${ }^{\text {cases. }}$ of the will of the deceased executor,"; and
> (b) by inserting in that paragraph, after the word " copy ", the words ", or verified copies,".

## STOCK.

## No. 51 of 1951.

## AN ACT to amend the Stock Act 1932. [12 October, 1951.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1-(1) This Act may be cited as the Stock Act 1951.

Short title and citation.
(2) The Stock Act 1932*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section nine of the Principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the following subsection:-
"(9) The regulations may regulate, control, and prohibit Governor to establish quarantine the movement of persons, and of animals, vehicles, equipment, goods, articles, and other things, into, within, and out of, quarantine grounds; and may prescribe, or authorise any prescribed officer to give directions with respect to, the conditions, measures, and precautions to be observed and taken by or with respect to any persons, and any animals, vehicles, equipment, goods, articles, and other things, moving into, within, or out of, any quarantine grounds; and may regulate generally the management and control of quarantine grounds.".

[^0]3 Section sixty-two of the Principal Act is amended by omitting paragraph x. of subsection (2) thereof and substituting therefor the following paragraph:-
" $x$. The cases in which, and the manner in which, areas may be declared to be infected areas or clean areas in relation to any prescribed disease or in relation to disease generally; and the regulation, control, and prohibition of the movement of persons, and of animals, vehicles, equipment, goods, articles, and other things to, from, or within any infected area or clean area, either generally or in prescribed cases; and may prescribe, or authorise any prescribed officer to give directions with respect to, the conditions, measures, and precautions to be observed and taken for preventing, checking, or minimising the spread of disease from infected areas to clean areas; but so that no powers conferred by or under this paragraph shall be exercisable in relation to the disease known as Brucellosis.".

## EXPIRING LAWS CONTINUANCE (No. 2).

## No. 52 of 1951.

AN ACT to continue certain expiring Laws. [12 October, 1951.]
 are, in so far as they are in force and are temporary in their duration, limited to expire-
(a) as respects those mentioned in Part I. of the schedule, on the thirty-first day of October, nineteen hundred and fifty-one;
(b) as respects those mentioned in Part II. of the schedule, on the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and fifty-one; and
(c) as respects those mentioned in Part III. of the schedule, on the thirtieth day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty-two:
And whereas it is expedient to provide for the continuance, as in this Act mentioned, of those Acts and of the enactments amending or affecting the same:
