

21—(1) No person shall—

- (a) in an application for a loan or gift under this Act, in evidence in support of such an application, or for the purposes of section eight, make a statement which to his knowledge is false in a material particular; or
- (b) having received a loan or gift under this Act, use it or any part thereof contrary to the conditions on which it was made.

Penalty: Three hundred pounds or six months' imprisonment.

(2) No person who, under section eight, is lawfully required to produce to the Board a book, paper, document, or account, or to give information to the Board, shall fail or refuse so to do without just cause.

Penalty: Thirty pounds.

22 The Governor may make regulations for the purposes of this Act and may prescribe a penalty, not exceeding thirty pounds, for a breach of the regulations.

SUPPLY 1960-1961.

No. 2 of 1960.

AN ACT to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1961. [25 May 1960.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Supply Act 1960-1961.*

Short title.

Issue and application of £4,723,700.

2 There may be issued and applied towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1961 the sum of £4,723,700 out of the Consolidated Revenue, for the purposes and services expressed in the schedule, and the Treasurer is authorized to issue and apply the moneys so authorized to be issued and applied.

Sum available for the purposes set forth in schedule.

3 The sum specified in section two is made available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor in respect of any purposes and services set forth in the schedule.

Credit to be given to the Treasurer in accounts.

4 The Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any warrant mentioned in section three, and the receipts of the respective persons to whom any sums of money are so paid are a full and valid discharge to the Treasurer in passing his accounts for such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for them accordingly.
