**4** Section five of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (4) the words “established by the Society to administer an approved scheme”.

Subsidies.

**5** Section seven of the Principal Act is amended by omitting subsection (1) and substituting therefor the following subsection:—

“(1) The Attorney-General may pay to the Society or a committee a subsidy of such amount as he may determine towards defraying the costs of administering an approved scheme.”.

**6** Section nine of the Principal Act is amended by omitting the words “the approved scheme for the Division of the State in which he resides” and substituting therefor the words “an approved scheme”.

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## SUPPLY 1968-1969.

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### No. 7 of 1968.

AN ACT to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1969. [13 June 1968.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

**1** This Act may be cited as the *Supply Act 1968-1969*.

Issue and  
application of  
\$21,436,300.

**2** There may be issued and applied towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1969 the sum of \$21,436,300 out of the Consolidated Revenue, for the purposes and services expressed in the schedule, and the Treasurer is authorized to issue and apply the moneys so authorized to be issued and applied.

**3** The sum specified in section two is made available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor in respect of any purposes and services set forth in the schedule.

Sum available for the purposes set forth in schedule.

**4** The Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any warrant mentioned in section three, and the receipts of the respective persons to whom any sums of money are so paid are a full and valid discharge to the Treasurer in passing his accounts for such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for them accordingly.

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## TRANSPORT.

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### No. 8 of 1968.

AN ACT to authorize the Transport Commission to continue to carry on certain road transport services until the thirtieth day of November 1968. [28 June 1968.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Transport Act* 1968.

(2) This Act is incorporated, and shall be read as one, with the *Transport Act* 1938 (in this Act referred to as the Principal Act).

Short title and incorporation.

Authority to Commission to carry on certain road transport services.

**2** Notwithstanding anything in section eleven B of the Principal Act, the Commission may, until the thirtieth day of November 1968 but no longer, continue to carry on all or any of the road transport services that were being carried on by it immediately before the thirtieth day of June 1968.
