AN ACT to amend the State Advances Act 1935 and the State Advances Act 1946.

[10 May 1962.]

B^E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:---

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the State Advances Act short title and citation. **1962**.

(2) The State Advances Act 1935, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section seven of the Principal Act is amended by omitting Dismissal of the words "(other than a member who, at the time of his appointed appointment, was an officer of the Public Service)".

3 After section eleven of the Principal Act the following section is inserted in Part II:—

"12 Subject to this Act, the Treasurer may, on such terms Advances to and conditions as he thinks fit, make advances to the Board Board by for the purposes of this Act out of moneys provided by Parliament for the purpose.". No. 13.
