**AN ACT to amend the Stock Act 1932 for the purposes of enabling castrated male oxen imported into this State to be exempted from detention in quarantine and extending the power of making regulations under that Act with respect to certain matters.**

[Royal Assent 21 May 1980]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—This Act may be cited as the *Stock Amendment Act 1980*.

Short title.

Principal Act. **2**—In this Act, the *Stock Act 1932\** is referred to as the Principal Act.

Amendment of section 9 of Principal Act (Power of Governor to establish quarantine grounds).

**3**—Section 9 of the Principal Act is amended as follows:—

(a) by omitting from subsection (3) “All” and substituting “Subject to subsection (3A), all”;

(b) by inserting the following subsection after subsection (3):—

(3A) If regulations made under this Act so prescribe, whether unconditionally or subject to prescribed conditions or generally or in prescribed circumstances, subsection (3) does not apply to castrated male oxen.

Amendment of section 62 of Principal Act (Regulations).

**4**—(1) Section 62 of the Principal Act is amended by omitting paragraph (e) of subsection (2) and substituting the following paragraph:—

(e) either generally or for prescribed purposes or occasions—

(i) the regulation and control of the landing in this State, and the shipment from this State, of any prescribed animals or classes of animals, including, without prejudice to the generality of this subparagraph, prescribing the places at or from which those animals or classes of animals shall be landed or shipped and prescribing the conditions to which such a landing or shipment shall be subject; and

(ii) the prohibition of the landing in this State, and the prohibition of the shipment from this State, of any prescribed animals or classes of animals, either absolutely or except at or from prescribed places and subject to the prescribed conditions;

(2) Section 62 of the Principal Act is further amended by inserting the following subsection after subsection (3):—

(4) Regulations made for the purposes of subsection (2) (e) or section 9 (3A) may provide that it is an offence for a person to contravene, or fail to comply with, any of the regulations and may provide in respect of any such offence for the imposition of a penalty not exceeding \$10 000 or 12 months' imprisonment.

**5**—The amendments effected by sections 3 and 4 shall expire on 30th June 1981, and after that date the Principal Act shall have effect as if those sections had never been enacted. Expiry of amendments to Principal Act.
