SULLIVANS COVE PLANNING AMENDMENT ACT 1996

No. 43 of 1996

An Act to amend the Sullivans Cove Planning Act 1995

[Royal Assent 16 December 1996]

Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Sullivans Cove Planning Amendment Act 1996.

Commencement

2. This Act commences on the day after the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.

Section 14A inserted

3. After section 14 of the *Sullivans Cove Planning Act* 1995*, the following section is inserted:

Alternate members of Sullivans Cove Advisory Committee

- 14A. (1) For the purposes of this Part -
 - (a) an alternate member is to be appointed for each member of the Committee referred to in section 14(2)(e), (f), (g), (h), (i) and (j); and
 - (b) appointments of alternate members are to be made
 - (i) as soon as practicable after the commencement of the Sullivans Cove Planning Amendment Act 1996; and
 - (ii) if subsequently there is a vacancy in the office of a member or alternate member.
- (2) For the purposes of subsection (1), the office of an alternate member is vacant when he or she dies or if he or she is incapable of acting as such a member.
- (3) An alternate member is to act as a member of the Committee only if the member for whom he or she is an alternate dies or only while that member –

- (a) is absent from a meeting of the Committee; or
- (b) is incapable of acting as a member.
- (4) Where an alternate member acts as a member of the Committee
 - (a) he or she may exercise all the powers of the member for whom he or she is an alternate member; and
 - (b) all things done or omitted to be done by the alternate member are as valid, and have the same consequences, as if they had been done or omitted to be done by the member for whom he or she is an alternate member.
