

METROPOLITAN TRANSPORT.

No. 46 of 1957.

AN ACT to amend the *Metropolitan Transport Act 1954.* [1 November 1957.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Metropolitan Transport Act 1957.*

Short title and citation.

(2) The *Metropolitan Transport Act 1954*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 After section forty-five of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:—

“45A Notwithstanding anything in the *Police Offences Act 1935*—

- (a) if any moneys or goods are left in or on any tram or other vehicle of the Trust and the owner thereof is not known, the Trust may, without thereby being under any liability therefor, take possession of the moneys or goods and at any time thereafter cause it to be notified, by advertisement in a newspaper published in this State, that the moneys will be forfeited or the goods will be sold upon such a day, being not less than thirty days after the publication thereof, as may be specified in the advertisement; and
- (b) if before the day so specified the moneys or goods are not claimed by, and proved to belong to, some person, the moneys shall be deemed to be forfeited to, and to be the property of, the Trust or, as the case may be, the goods may be sold by the Trust and the net proceeds of the sale thereof may be retained by the Trust.”
