AN ACT to amend the State Employees (Long-Service Leave) Act 1950 in relation to service by student teachers before 1st January 1970.

[28 April 1977]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *State Employees (Long-Service Leave) Act 1977*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *State Employees (Long-Service Leave) Act 1950**, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section 5 of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by inserting in subsection (3B), after the word “scholarship”, the words “(other than a teacher-training scholarship)”; and
- (b) by inserting after that subsection the following subsection:—
- “(3C) In subsection (3B), ‘teacher-training scholarship’ means a scholarship or studentship granted under the regulations made under the *Education Act* 1932 to a person for the purposes of his training as a teacher.”.

Application of
amendments.

3 Where a period of continuous service is terminated before the commencement of this Act, the amendments made by this Act do not apply in respect of any service by an employee as the holder of a Government scholarship that is rendered before the termination of that continuous service.
